The Origami White China Blossom table (feature here) is finished in porcelain-like lacquer and has hand-painted posies of spring flowers. Other furniture pieces include the French Renaissance inspired Highback Mop Chair showing intricate, high-gloss lacquered floral motif in mother-of-pearl inlay; the Mughal Console with delicate jaali-work in composite stone accented with abalone shell inlay; the Origami Accent Table in teak wood and hammered brass; and a Twin Console consisting of two occasional table-like elements bedecked with hand-painted spring flowers.
